All orders and money need to be returned by **Friday June 29, 2018**.


The delivery date will be **Wednesday July 4** and can be collected from school between **3.00—3.30pm**.


The students worked in groups and they all came up with some really good answers to why we use the Learning Intention and Success Criteria.


Moral: *Better a crowded hut than a lonely mansion.*


