



# Year 3/4/5



Students in Mrs Freer's class have been focusing on Natural Disasters this term. Yesterday we had a visit from the Australian Red Cross to discuss the Pillow case Project. The main focus of the lesson was for students to:

- Understand and discuss the importance of being prepared
- Prepare their mind for the thoughts and feelings that may arise before, during and after an emergency
- Know the difference between need and want items and what to pack in an emergency kit.

Students worked on breathing exercises to learn how to remain calm, they worked in small groups to discuss what are needs and wants and what they thought to be important items they will need to take in a disaster. They are currently decorating a pillowcase with the items they deem important to take with them if a disaster occurs and will take these home in the hope they are prepared if a disaster does occur.

You should always have a bag or pillow case packed and ready in case of a disaster. **Willow**

Make sure you are ready before a disaster happens not wait until it happens.



# Pillowcase Project

The Pillow case project was originally inspired by events during Hurricane Katrina in the US. While evacuating campus, students at a local University used pillowcases to carry their cherished possessions. After hearing this, Red Cross staff developed the concept of using a pillowcase as an emergency kit. The program grew quickly into a preparedness education program that has since been known as the Pillowcase Program.
