

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends,

The term is now well underway and looking around the school it is wonderful to see that the students have settled in so well to the new school year and are deeply engaged in their learning. The introduction of the Welcome Circle every morning has been a very positive change for our school. We come together as a whole school to start the day at 8:50am. We share the Acknowledgement of Country, greet each other by name, fill our buckets with positivity, share important news and have a little fun together.

Our student attendance for 2020 has started out great! Thank you to parents and carers for supporting students to attend school every day. For students to achieve growth in their learning we need them to be at school every day! Let's work together to achieve this.

Last Monday all staff participated in the first day of the Berry Street Education Model training. Through this training staff will learn and develop trauma informed practices which will support our students to engage positively in the school and their learning. This is the first of four days of training that staff will undertake over the next two years.

As part of our reading improvement strategy we have implemented a whole school reading time after lunch Monday to Thursday. Students come together with staff in the library for 20 mins and we engage in shared, independent and modelled reading. This is one action we have implemented towards improving reading across our school.



Hi everyone,

I love how positively the term has started with the Welcome Circle in the morning and all the great learning and acts of kindness so far at Glossop!

It's also been quite a busy term, with lots of activities and learning. We can get so busy at home too with extra activities, sports, cooking, cleaning and all the other jobs that need doing. You might have meetings and be involved in various clubs. It's important to remember to schedule in (if you need to) some time for rest and relaxation. A good night sleep is very important for all of us. This might surprise you, but according to your age this is how much sleep you should be getting (from the website sleepcouncil.org.uk):

1-12 months old: 14-15 hours per day

1-3 years old: 12-14 hours per day

3-6 years old: 10-12 hours per day

7-12 years old: 10-11 hours per day

12-18 years old: 8-9 hours per day

18-65 years old: 7-9 hours per day

65+ years old: 7-8 hours per day



So children in primary school should be getting between 10-12 hours of sleep a night and parents and carers should be getting between 7-9 hours. I know it's something I need to be more mindful of – getting to bed a little earlier. Also research has shown that we sleep better if we don't have any screen time for an hour before we go to bed. With a good night sleep we will perform better, be more productive and can better tackle any problems that might arise through the day.

I hope you have a good night sleep and a fantastic week.
